Ukraine

The United Methodist Church is active in world crises! You can help the Ukraine in the midst of war's atrocities. The Ukraine UMC has created a crisis committee that will oversee all the global support that is coming in through UMCOR's Advance #14053A "Eurasia In Mission Together - Ukraine and Moldova." The money channeled through this Advance fund will go to the Ukraine UMC church account and decisions on how this will be used will be considered by the crisis committee, which includes pastors as well as lay leaders.
