Red Bird Mission Trip Youth and Adult Trip Planned for August 6 - 13 Youth and adults are invited to join the seven folks already signed up for a trip to the Red Bird Mission in Kentucky this summer! Red Bird Mission offers a chance to learn new skills, make new friends and stretch our faith in taking on repair projects for nearby residents and at the Mission itself. The busy week will include the actual repair work selected for our group plus evening programs, worship, music, Biblical messages, and daily devotions. We leave on Saturday the 6th, overnight along the way and begin our work on Sunday through Friday. We get back on Saturday the 13th. Planning meetings and fundraisers will be held throughout the period leading up to the trip. The registration is \$425 although fundraising is planned to lower that amount. <u>Church Camp</u> - For years, <u>our Church Family, at CUMC</u>, has seen our youth head off to **Camp Casowasco or Aldersgate**. We have had the pleasure of witnessing the positive impact these camps have on our youth.

With the help of donations made to the CUMC Campership Fund, we will be able to pay 1/3 of the Casowasco cost. Camp Casowasco currently has Scholarship Funds available to pay an additional 1/3 of the campership. Families or sponsors are asked to pay 1/3 of the cost or 2/3 if possible.

Campership funding is also available, from this same fund, to pay part of the cost for Camp Aldersgate.
