

Dear Friends,

It is my joy to greet you in the name of God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - as we enter the second month of 2025. Yes, it is February already. Welcome to this publication of Church Chat. I trust you find its contents interesting, informative and inspiring.

There are two days that stand out in February, Valentine's Day (14th) and Presidents' Day (17th). While these are not religious observances, there is something about both days that prompted me to mention them. On Valentine's Day we think about love. It's that day when individuals express their love for each other in a variety of ways. It is usually thought of as a romantic day. It is the theme of love that I emphasize here. In the Greek language, there are a few words for love that show its different shades of meaning from mere passion, feeling or emotion to that which is selfless and unconditional. In Christian teaching we are exhorted to love one another. This love transcends the barriers, feelings and all the distinctions we might apply when it comes to the ways we differentiate one another.

Presidents' Day is the popular name given to the holiday celebrating George Washington's life and achievements. In addition, the day is set aside to honor and celebrate all past United States presidents particularly Washington, Abraham Lincoln and Thomas Jefferson.

Here is the connection I want to make between these two days in February. Presidents' Day is a day when we remember the men who have served as President, a position of power, privilege and prestige. Whoever has served as the President of the United States of America has occupied one of the most powerful offices that any human being can hold in this nation. With such power comes great responsibility and those who do best are guided by the principles of love.

Jesus taught his disciples to love their enemies. This is what he said, "But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you" (Luke 6:27-28). I think Abraham Lincoln understood this when he remarked, "Have I not destroyed my enemy when I have made him into my friend?" Love is a powerful force and those with power must exercise it with love as God does.

Throughout the Bible we are reminded of God's omnipotence (all powerful). "Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God" (Psalm 62:11); "Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure" (Psalm 147:5). The Bible equally emphasizes God's benevolence (love or goodness). "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love" (1 John 4:7,8).

While not every person will be President, everyone can show love. The world needs it; our country needs it. The words of the song continue to echo through the years and call us to love:

"What the world needs now is love, sweet love It's the only thing that there's just too little of What the world needs now is love, sweet love No not just for some but for everyone"

Finance Corner: February 2025 - Bits & Pieces

As we begin to settle into 2025, the Finance Team has been busy drafting and approving the budget for 2025. I thought I would share some of my insights and thoughts on this process.

First, I want to thank everyone that dug a little deeper into their pockets and helped us to finish out 2024 with all our bills paid and our Shared Ministries paid in full! What a blessing – thank you to everyone for your generosity. We couldn't have done it without you.

As we worked on the budget, I couldn't help but think of the analogy of doing a jigsaw puzzle. This is one of my favorite pastimes on a cold winter day!

The budget, like a puzzle, has four corners. The 4 cornerstones for Cicero UMC might be considered as follows:

1) The Upper New York Conference and the General Church

- 2) CUMC-the building, parsonage & property
- 3) CUMC- the people staff, members, children and guests
- 4) CUMC- the missions & programs we support

The "pieces" of the budget are all the income and expense items that are required to draft the total budget. The actual size of the puzzle/budget is determined by these items.

The UNY Conference determines the amount of our Shared Ministries each year based on an annual calculation. Our ministry share helps to underwrite the cost of the mission and ministry of our Conference and the General Church. Our Shared Ministries amount for 2025 is \$58,884.

The Cicero UMC building, parsonage & property all incur various operations expenses that we must include in our budget. Items such as Utilities, Trash removal, Mowing, Plowing, Custodial supplies, Office supplies, Technology, plus general maintenance and repairs.

The people of CUMC include paid staff positions in addition to our many volunteers, members and guests. These positions include our Pastor, Deacon, Director of Education, Director of Music, Director of Praise and Worship, Admin Assistant, Tech Specialist and others.

The Missions & Programs of CUMC include many areas such as Education, Worship, Music, Evangelism, Discipleship, Community Outreach, Communications, God's Country, Older Adult Ministry. In addition, CUMC supports various other ministries such as Canteen, Brown Memorial, Scouting USA, Honor Flight and Safe Sanctuaries.

As you can see, we have a vibrant and active church! It's a large puzzle – with a variety of pieces that all need to fit together. The total budget is approximately \$400,000. Please note that we will be collecting for Fuel Sundays again during Jan/Feb/Mar to help offset our utility costs this winter.

We also have approximately 50 boxes of 2025 weekly Offering envelopes available for those that may want them. These can be useful reminders for those that give weekly. They are not assigned "numbers". This allows us to order the quantity we need. We will have some boxes placed in the Welcome Center or you can stop by to see Mary in the office.

The 2024 Year End giving statements will be handed out after the church service sometime in the next few weeks. A copy can be emailed or mailed upon request.

I hope you enjoyed my puzzle analogy! And I hope this provided some insight into our budget. Thank you for your continued support of our church and may you have a blessed year ahead!

Bible Study


The Lenten Bible Study Series will occur from March 11 to April 15th at 11 AM and 6:30 PM more information to come.
