

Dear Friends

I greet you warmly in the name of our Risen Savior as I commend this spring or Easter publication of the Newsletter. "I also pray that you will understand the incredible greatness of God's power for us who believe in him. This is the same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead and seated him in the place of honor at God's right hand in the heavenly realms" (Ephesians 1:19-20).

It seems appropriate that with the Festival of the Resurrection being a major event this month that we should reflect on what it means that Christ was raised from the dead.

First, there is the Resurrection mystery. No one can fully grasp or explain the Resurrection. The four gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John give us a version of what took place on the first day of the week following the Crucifixion. Matthew tells us that as the women were going to look at the tomb in which the body of Jesus was placed after it had been taken down from the cross, "There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it" (28:2). Mysteriously the Risen Christ appeared to several of his disciples on various occasions over a period of time. He seemed unrecognizable to those who knew him and they even treated him like a stranger. He seemed tangible preparing a meal for them and eating with them. On the other hand, he seemed ghostlike being visible then vanishing from sight. The mystery is what makes the resurrection such a wonder, a glorious act of God, and the centerpiece of Christian faith.

The Resurrection of Christ helps us rewrite our story. It gives us a new script to follow. There are so many things that can be viewed differently because of Christ's Resurrection. For example, we can have a different attitude to those who insult us, and treat us badly because Jesus was able to forgive those who spat on him, beat him, mocked him and crucified him. He was able to rise above that treatment, above hatred and sin. As the writer to the Hebrews puts it, "Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary in your souls or lose heart" (12:3). We can have faith in God through our painful experiences when we look to Jesus who drank the bitter cup of suffering to its final dregs, endured the cross, and in his darkest hour trusted God to whom he committed his spirit.

The Resurrection signals victory. It is the victory in the war against evil where Christ who was the victim of a cruel death on a Roman cross is now the victor. As the hymn writer puts it, "The strife is o'er, the battle done; the victory of life is won". All who thought the Crucifixion meant defeat and the end of Jesus could take heart and rejoice at the victory he secured. The victory that Jesus won is over death. As the Apostle Paul writes, "The last enemy to be destroyed is death" (1 Corinthians 15:26). Paul writes further, "When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory" (1 Corinthians 15:54 see also Isaiah 25:8; Hebrews 2:14–15; Revelation 20:14 and 21:4). The victory is what makes the resurrection such a powerful act of God and enables believers to live victoriously and without fear.

Will's silly socks are also included in every care package given to caregivers by David's Refuge

Finance Notes:

Happy Spring! This morning, I heard mourning doves and saw robins in our yard. We've also had a brief stint of beautiful weather in the last few days reminding us of what is yet to come. Things are finally looking up after a tough winter!

Here at CUMC, March and April are very important months with Lent, Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter. It is a very special time of year for all of us on our faith journey together.

Our Finance Committee met on March 19th and reviewed the first quarter of the year. We discussed the idea of providing quarterly financial updates in addition to our typical year-end reporting. We are currently projecting that as of 3/31/2025 we will show a year-to-date deficit of approximately \$16,000.

As you all know, household expenses continue to increase and here at CUMC we are also feeling the pinch. We've tried to come up with ways to offset these rising costs, such as our Fuel Sunday offering. We're pleased to report that as of 3/17 we have received \$2,095 to assist with the utility costs at CUMC! Thank you for your continued support, it is very much appreciated.

Knowing that the current projected deficit will likely continue to grow, we would like to ask each of you to please prayerfully consider increasing your current monthly giving by just 10% per month. If we all try to do this, then we may be able to finish out the year in better shape.

Please note that we have many ways in which to donate to CUMC. In addition to the weekly offering, we have a QR code that you can scan with your phone's QR reader to donate electronically, or you can also give online using EZ Tithe. Please reach out to the church office, or a member of the Finance Team if you have any questions.

I would like to conclude by letting you all know that the Finance Team has voted on which charitable organization will be the beneficiary of this year's Lenten Offering. As you may remember, last year we chose Sleep in Heavenly Peace and successfully raised \$5,200! Let's hope we can have the same success in 2025!

This year we have chosen Will's Angels. This is an organization that was founded when the coordinator's son passed away from a neurological degenerative disease. He was nonverbal and nonmobile, but he brought joy to many with his smiles. 

Long-Range Planning for CUMC Has Begun!!

It's been over 20 years since CUMC last undertook a close look at our worship, missions, programs, outreach and facilities. That past effort led to additions to our ministries, worship services, property and facilities that we take for granted today. Considering the major changes that have occurred and are anticipated in our church and throughout the community over the next few years, it was determined that it was time to consider the future of CUMC in the near and long term.

A Long-Range Planning (LRP) Committee has been meeting and working with a team of experienced pastors from our Conference since last summer. On December 12, 2024, the Conference Team provided a report with feedback to the CUMC LRP team with seven focused recommendations. Effectively roll out the new Vision/Mission/Core Values

Perform a comprehensive communication audit and develop a communications plan.


These efforts have been ongoing since last December and so far have resulted in:
