

Dear Friends

It is my delight to greet you in the name of our Risen Lord and Savior. I pray that you will have joy because in God's great mercy we have been given new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead (1 Peter 1:3). This month's publication of the Newsletter comes in the spirit of peace and with the grace of the Risen Christ. We trust that you will be encouraged and edified.

May is a month when I remember some significant persons and events. First, I remember my father, Collins C. Niles, and offer a brief tribute to him. He was born on May 2, 1936, a few months before Pope Francis who died the day after the celebration of the Festival of Resurrection. My father died on February 18, 2021 just as we were coming out of the Covid pandemic. He was a devoted husband and father, a dedicated member of the Church, and a devout Christian. I remember my father as a man of many skills and one who was good at coming up with solutions to problems. He was persistent, patient, and a pragmatist. I thank God for my father's example and how he helped to shape and guide my life.

Secondly, in this month of May we remember our Methodist heritage. It was May 24, 1738 when John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, had what is known as his Aldersgate experience. This was a pivotal moment in Wesley's life and remains an important date in the history of Methodism. In addition, his younger brother, Charles Wesley, had a similar spiritual experience a few days earlier on May 21, 1738 that profoundly influenced the direction of his life. Some of the great hymns of Methodism were composed to mark the experiences of the Wesley brothers. Two of those hymns are: Where Shall My Wondering Soul Begin, known as the Wesleys' Conversion hymn, and the other, And Can It Be That I Should Gain. So as we remember our Methodist founders, John and Charles Wesley, and celebrate our heritage, let us pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Church, for renewal, revival and restoration.

Finally, on the last Monday of May we will observe Memorial Day as we remember those who died in the military in service to the country. They made the ultimate sacrifice and it is fitting that we honor their service and sacrifice. Here is a quote from Charlie Dent that's appropriate for our Memorial Day observance: "Freedom does not come without a price. We may sometimes take for granted the many liberties we enjoy in America, but they have all been earned through the ultimate sacrifice paid by so many of the members of our armed forces".

So let us remember. I am always struck by how many times in the Bible we find admonitions to remember. A key example is found in Deuteronomy where the Israelites are told not to forget the Lord. Here is an important verse from that chapter: "But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant, which he swore to your ancestors, as it is today" (Deuteronomy 8:18).

When each succeeding generation remembers the teachings, example and sacrifice of those who have gone before it leads to gratitude, success, and a life of faithfulness and fulfillment.
